Swiss Military Small Band Oceania Tour

In New Zealand, Swiss National Day was celebrated this year in a very special way. For the first time ever, a Swiss Army Band has visited New Zealand! There have been several visits by New Zealand Military Bands to Switzerland in the past and also a memorable performance of the civilian Top Secret Drum Corps from Basel at the 2016 Royal Edinburgh Military Tattoo in Wellington. But now Ambassador David Vogelsanger had convinced the Department of Defence to send a formation of the Swiss Army Band on the longest trip they have ever taken.

From 27 July to 1 August, the formation of sixteen young musicians gave a dozen performances in Auckland, Taranaki, New Plymouth and Wellington. The Swiss Military Small Band joined forces with their New Zealand counterparts, the New Zealand Army Band, the Royal New Zealand Navy Band and the Royal New Zealand Air Force Band. The bands never failed to delight spectators with their brilliant musicianship and extensive and sometimes surprising repertoire.



During the Australian leg of their first ever tour in Oceania, the Swiss Military Small Band gave five concerts together with Australian musicians in three cities: in Canberra, the performances for the celebration of the Swiss National Day at the Embassy

happily coincided with the 50th anniversary of the Australian Army Band Corps. The Swiss Band also performed at the Australian War Memorial in Canberra to commemorate the end of the First World War one hundred years ago. In Sydney, the Band played at the National Day Celebration

of the Swiss Yodlers, and the next day they performed at the Swiss Club of Victoria in Melbourne. On 8 August they delighted audiences at Federation Square right in the heart of Melbourne, concluding their extensive Oceania tour. To join the Swiss musicians for combined performances, Australia mobilised the Australian Army Band, the Royal Australian Navy Band and the Royal Australian Air Force Band, as well as the Royal Australian Military College Band. The musical harmony between the bands was a strong symbol for the solid friendship and reliable cooperation between Switzerland and Australia.

This series of performances was organised by the Swiss Embassy in Canberra and the Consulate General in Sydney, with support from RUAG Australia.
