Servicemen's laundry Soldatenwäscherei Postfach 3110 Münsingen	Anyone who does not have the opportunity to wash his personal clothes may use the Army Laundry Service for free. With each dispatch, a copy of the marching order must be enclosed in the laundry bag (Wäschebox) ap- proved by the Military Post. → Information can be obtained from the welfare officer at your recruit school or at the Army Welfare Service
New underclothes CEVI Militär Service Postfach 8032 Zürich	New underclothes are distributed by the CEVI Militär Service. → Information can be obtained from the Army Welfare Service → Linen is issued only via the Army Welfare Service

Vaucher 18 1211 Genf 2 T: 058 461 91 11 F: 058 461 97 05	You have a right to claim appropriate compensation for loss of earnings or trade, even if you are currently a stu- dent or non-employed. → Information can be obtained from the troops quarter- master or accountant of your recruit school. Swiss abroad who have not yet worked in Switzerland should send their loss of earnings order (Erwerbsausfall- ordnung – EO) card to the Swiss Compensation Fund in Geneva (Caisse Suisse de compensation). Swiss abroad who have worked in Switzerland at some

	time in the 12 months before attending the military service should send their loss of earnings order (EO) card to their previous employer.
Military insurance Militärversicherung Suva Sites: Bern, St. Gallen, Genf, Bellinzona Postal address: Service Center, Postfach, 6009 Luzern Internet: www.suva.ch/militaerversicherung	While in service, all members of the army are insured in case of sickness and accidents.
Health insurance	If you have been in Switzerland for some time before the military service, you will already have taken out a Swiss health insurance. The basic health insurance coverage will be suspended if military service lasts more than 60 days. To be suspended from the obligatory health insurance, members of the Swiss armed forces must submit a copy of the marching order to his or her health insurance company. Supplementary health insurance will continue and need to be paid.
Employment	While at the recruit school you can also look for a job in Switzerland. Support for this is organized at all schools. → Information can be obtained from the welfare officer at your recruit school.
