Election of delegates (and deputy) representing Australia, Kiribati, Nauru, Papua New Guinea, Solomon Islands and Vanuatu

Based on the number of registered Swiss living in our region – about 26,550 – Australia* holds four seats on the Council. Delegates are elected for a term of four years; the current term will expire in August this year.

The four candidates receiving the highest number of votes will be elected as full members of the CSA. Provided the mandate is accepted, the candidate with the fifth highest number of votes will be elected deputy. If the mandate is refused, it shall go to the candidate next in line. The deputy has full voting rights at Council meetings when deputising for a CSA delegate. The deputy is also encouraged to cooperate in CSA tasks as required. Should a seat become vacant mid-term, the deputy can assume the position of elected delegate for the remainder of the term.

Direct election via e-voting

The election will be carried out entirely by electronic means (e-voting), using a Swiss e-voting system. This will ensure that every eligible Swiss citizen will have the possibility to choose their representatives.

The election will be conducted by the **Swiss Alliance Australia Inc (SAA)** on behalf of the Organisation of the Swiss Abroad (OSA), with the assistance of the Swiss Federal Government (FDFA) and the Consulate General of Switzerland in Sydney. The election coordinator is Claude Alain Staub, former SAA president and current committee member.

- 12 April: Email with voting instructions sent by the Federal Department of Foreign Affairs (FDFA) to voters. Online ballot box opens.
- **11 May:** Online ballot box closes.
- **19 May:** Election results submitted by BFH (Berner Fachhochschule) to OSA.
- **23 May:** Communication of results by OSA.
- 21 August: Constitutive meeting of the newly elected Council.

For something new this year, we will start with a reflection on one of the highlights of 2024... A weekend spent representing the Swiss Club of South Australia at the SAA Oceania Swiss Clubs Conference in Sydney. Here is an overview:

Firstly, to the Swiss Alliance Australia Inc. organising committee – thank you for bringing us all together. As a group, we are uniquely positioned to appreciate exactly how much effort goes into organising events, so thank you, truly. As well as a great excuse to dust off the Swiss language skills, being invited to be a part of the conference wearing many hats – as a community leader, a thought provocateur and a workshop facilitator – made it all the more fun! My key conference takeaway was our unpacking of the question, "What has changed (what have we observed) since the early days of Swiss Clubs?" Here is what we found:

1. Technology. Love it or hate it, technology has fundamentally disrupted the way in which we connect with each other. It now sometimes replaces the social connections that clubs once provided, and allows us to stay in touch with those back in CH more easily.

2. Ease of travel. With changes in work-visa requirements and work packages, the number of Swiss migrating to AUS appears to have decreased, while the number of 2nd and 3rd generation Swaussies is increasing.

3. Shorter commitments. We are more hesitant to commit ahead of time, and have changed our expectations about what we are willing to give / get from a club, in our time poor lives.

4. Globalisation is challenging traditional concepts of patriotism, as many people identify with more than one culture.

Whilst this might sound like a long list of challenges, the energy in the room was one of collective relief – "it's not just me, others are seeing this shift too". A big thank you to all who participated for being

Seeing Sydney, Knowing Country



In May 2025, the exhibition Seeing Sydney, Knowing Country will open in Sydney. Museums of History NSW (MHNSW, considered 'the home of history' in NSW) is presenting an overview and examination of the development of the NSW colony after the arrival of British

colonists in the late 18th century and the start of the dispossession of First Nations peoples and their displacement from the land they had been custodians of for 60,000 years.

An important part of this exhibition is a large selection of early Sydney views from the Beat Knoblauch Collection, in addition to other significant historical maps, plans, sketches, artworks and various objects.

Beat is well-known in the Swiss community, most notably he is a current delegate to the Council of the Swiss Abroad. His genuine interest in the history and development of Sydney, his new home, started soon after arriving in Australia and he is now the proud owner of a unique private collection of more than 300 engravings, prints, water colours, paintings, photographs and postcard souvenir books, some very rare.


