South Africa:

Federer meets Kolisi on South African trip to support early learning

Swiss tennis great Roger Federer met up with Springbok rugby captain Siya Kolisi on a visit to South Africa in February, where Federer's charitable foundation funds projects to try to get more children into schools and stop them dropping out.

Swiss tennis great Roger Federer met up with Springbok rugby captain Siya Kolisi on a visit to South Africa in February, where Federer's charitable foundation funds projects to try to get more children into schools and stop them dropping out.

Asked why he chose South Africa for his charity's work, Federer said it was a "natural fit" as his mother was from a Johannesburg suburb.

Sitting alongside Kolisi, the 20-times Grand Slam champion told reporters he was inspired by the rugby player's journey and wanted to do more to support early childhood education in the region.

His foundation has given grants worth millions of dollars for early learning projects across six Southern

African countries: South Africa, Lesotho, Zimbabwe, Zambia, Malawi and Namibia.

Kolisi's rise from poverty to leading South Africa's national team to two Rugby World Cup wins is a story many in South Africa have rallied behind, and his foundation also funds education projects. "Helping is contagious. I want to make sure that I speak of South Africa wherever I go. And I want to bring people to the communities that need help," Kolisi said.

A World Bank report released last week said South Africa faced a "learning crisis," with education outcomes too low for its level of development and shrinking state funding for basic education.

Around 1.2 million more children are expected to enter South Africa's school system by 2030, which would require an additional 20,000 classrooms and hiring 25,000 new teachers, the report said.

"(Children) need playgrounds ... and books to learn. But most importantly, they need passionate and knowledgeable teachers... and they need them by 2030," Federer said at a meeting with business leaders, urging them to work with his foundation on education projects.

Federer visited the Salani Primary School in South Africa's Mpumalanga province with Kolisi. He said he was impressed by how people there worked together for children's welfare.

"I think we all have the power to help one another. I think getting together, that I think is the key for success," Federer said.

Namibia:

New Namibia visa should be easy to obtain

Citizens from countries that do not grant Namibians visa-free travel should be able to obtain the upcoming necessary holiday visa smoothly. This was assured by the Ministry of Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety and Security (MHAISS) to the travel industry.

The Tour and Safari Association (TASA) announced the discussed regulations in a press release. Combined with what was already finalised, the picture is as follows.

- The visa requirement applies since 1 April 2025 to all citizens from countries that do not reciprocate Namibia's visa-free regime. These include Germany, Switzerland and Austria as well as the Netherlands, France and Italy. Great Britain and the USA are also on the list of 32 countries published by the Ministry of Home Affairs last year.
- The fee is 1,600 Namibia Dollar (currently just under 83 euros) for citizens of a country that is not a member of the African Union (for comparison: A Namibian pays 90 euros for a Schengen visa). There is no discount for children.

Visa available online and upon arrival

• It should be possible to apply for the visa online in advance using the application form available there. However, a website address has not yet been provided.

Editor's note from Namibian.org: The <u>existing application page</u> <u>for a holiday visa</u> does NOT apply to the new visa. It is aimed at citizens of countries for which a visa requirement has already existed for a long time.

The fee mentioned on this page is only N\$ 600. However, the requirements are significantly higher than those of the new visa. They are similar to those of the Schengen visa (invitation, deed of surety, bank statement for 6 months, etc.).

- The new visa, which comes into effect on 1 April, can also be applied for on arrival. The form required for this will replace the existing entry form, which is available on aeroplanes and at border posts.
- As is customary internationally, the Interpol database will be consulted when checking the visa application.

Visa fee also payable by credit card

- It is possible to pay the visa fee by credit card. The Ministry wants to equip the entry counters with card payment machines. This applies to the international airports near Windhoek and in Walvis Bay and the main border posts.
- The visa covers multiple entry, as required for cruise holiday-makers or in case of excursions to the Victoria Falls, for example.
- The exit form on departure will no longer be required in order to simplify the exit process and free up staff at the immigration counters.
- The Ministry intends to regularly review the list of countries with visa requirements by determining the visa regulations applying to Namibians in the countries concerned.
